CHARITY:

- April: Joe Wolf, 18, raised £5k in the London's Marathon for The Neuroblastoma Society, which battles childhood cancer in memory of a family friend's younger brother. Joe was later nominated for the Essex police Young People of the Year (YOPEY) award.
- June-Farleigh Hospice: Students raised £2,700 at the annual Musical Miscellany evening, organised & performed by the girls of Manor House & the boys of Montgomery's House. Parents & friends were treated to music ranging from choral singing to a rock band, & took part in a raffle & an auction.

FELSTED PREPARATORY SCHOOL

GENERAL:

- May: Chris Lee (Head of Years 3-4) set up a 'Heritage Trail Group' for Felsted where students & villagers worked together to set 8 boards around the village with information about key buildings & points of interest for Spring of 2012.

25th July:

450 'Grange Farm' from Felsted & Dunmow runners held its main summer event triathlon that started with swimming at Felsted Primary School followed by selected distances ranging from 100 yards to one mile along Flitch Way covering 5-10km between Felsted & Rayne. For the cycling there was a choice of 12-24 miles along Felsted lanes.

7. FELSTED CRIME REPORT:

GENERAL:

- Essex Police: Open forums held at the Holy Cross Church from 11:30am-12: 30pm on 9th March, 4th May & 6th July 2010. Neighbourhood Action Panel meetings was held at Swan Public House from 12:30-13:30pm on 9th March, 4th May & 6th July 2010.
- Vandals decided that the tubs & troughs of flowers in the village would look better upside-down & left many volunteers to re-pot them.

February:

- 17th February: Jewellery worth £300 was taken from a property in Ravens Crescent between 12:30 & 16:15pm. Between 7am & 16:20pm £50 damage was caused to the front door of a house in Bannister Green after thieves tried to force entry into a property. Nothing was stolen.
- 25th February: A man at Ravens Crescent attacked his wife claiming that she had put too many Brussels sprouts on his dinner plate & carried the abuse over the weekend. He was jailed for 16 weeks for actual bodily harm, two weeks for assault & another 16 weeks, consecutive, for the knife offence. He was also imposed an indefinite restraining order not to go within 100m of his wife's place of work, Felsted School, or to contact her directly or indirectly except via a solicitor. He threw the plate across the room, bit his wife on the tip of her nose, causing a 1cm cut, left her with a cut to her mouth, bleeding from her eye, swollen left eye, a cut under her eye & a cut to her knuckles.

March:

• 17th February: A piece of brick was thrown from a bridge at Station Road in Felsted that hit the windscreen of a truck on the A120.

May:

• 23rd May: A caravan was completely burnt out in a blaze.

August:

• 27th August: Fire crews were called after locals reported seeing a haystack burning. Fire fighters tackled the blaze at 11pm to a stack at Leez Lane, Hartford End, where 200 tonnes of straw was 100% alight on a concrete hard standing. The Fire fighters dealt with the incident by Sunday midday. It was believed deliberate, as there was no electrical supply or anything in the area at all.

photograph of the bride with her groom wearing the dress displayed. Organized by Paula Hatcher, her aim was to have a dress for each decade where she managed to get dresses from 1930's to 2010.

May:
