## 2. FELSTED CHARITY EVENTS:

#### Christian Aid & FELSTED Aide for Deprived Children Charity: 3 trips in 2014:

## February:

The photographer was village resident Wendy Clark. She said that in order to see the lights, people needed to be in a location with no streetlights and a clear horizon.

## 7. FELSTED PARISH COUNCIL:

# January: New Community Hall, Holy Cross Church

Felsted Parish Council and District Councillors supported planning application and finances for the new community hall extended to the Holy Cross Church. A comprehensive survey of 900 households in Felsted received 83% of the responses strongly supported the need for a modern / well equipped community facility. In February a survey activity took place and building works commenced in April. After 8 years of planning and fund raising, the start of building works took place on 19<sup>th</sup> September.

# **FEBRUARY**:

2014 marked the 100th Anniversary of the start of WWI where FPC felt that it was an appropriate time to arrange for the War Memorial to be refurbished.

# 20<sup>th</sup> FEBRUARY: Publication of the Felsted Parish Plan

The final Parish Plan document was produced and adopted by the Parish Council. The Plan reflects the views expressed by villagers in the survey, which was undertaken at the beginning of last year, and in the subsequent Exhibition. The Council intended to carry forward all the recommendations in the coming months of 2014.

## **EVENTS:**

- **16**<sup>th</sup> **February:** Felsted School's 450th anniversary celebrations. Every Year 9 pupil contributed at least one piece to the collaborative art project, and the result of their very own mural. The mural is of the main façade of Felsted, School House



The Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh took part of Felsted School's 450th anniversary celebrations. They unveiled two commemorative plaques – one for the 450th anniversary and the other to mark the rebuilding of the co-educational independent's Follyfield House, which was destroyed by fire in 2012. In the summer of 1964, the Queen Mother had visited the school when it celebrated its quadricentenary.

Her Majesty and Prince Philip arrived by car at around 12.35pm having attended a service at Chelmsford Cathedral as part of the centenary celebrations of Chelmsford Diocese. They were greeted by the school's headmaster, Dr Michael Walker, head of the preparatory school Jenny Burrett, chair of governors John Davies OBE, Uttlesford District Council chairman Cllr Eric Hicks, head boy Samuel Seacombe and head girl Lydia Carrington. The party then headed into the school for a four-course lunch, which included smoked salmon and asparagus terrine, pheasant smitane (though this surely could not be fresh pheasant as the season for shooting pheasant ended in February!) and spiced pears poached in red wine. Head girl Lydia sat next to the Duke during the meal and compared experiences of boarding school life and talked about the Duke of Edinburgh award scheme. The Queen and Duke then made their way into Lord Riche Hall – which was opened by the Queen's daughter, Princess Anne, in 1989 – for a special assembly.

Mr Davies gave a welcome speech before Dr Walker addressed the hall, where students were also gathered. The commemorative plaques were then unveiled, followed by the formal presentation of gifts to the royal couple including a portable boot scraper made and designed by Mr Mick Pitts, Head of Technology and Design with his fellow students and presented by Head boy Samuel. The Queen's Mother in 1964 received a portable boot scraper, which was originally suggested by Graeme Hall (editor of Everywoman in 1962) who past away in April 12<sup>th</sup> 2013.
